	<p>exception of our pre-school books, all of the stories we publish have a moral, and many of our upcoming titles will utilize a growing tool which, hopefully, teachers, parents, and guardians can use to carefully teach children that hate isn't the answer, no matter how different we are.</p> <p>Vintage Romance Publishing has long been a supporter of a domestic abuse causes and for the first three years of business donated a portion of its proceeds from the sales of its books each quarter. Recently, the company has chosen yearly charities to which to contribute ranging from children's causes to homeless shelters.</p> <p>In 2010, Vintage Romance Publishing, under its Spirit line, will release "Why Doesn't Mommy Love Me—a journey through child abuse." All proceeds from the sales of this book will be donated to Promises2Kids.org, an organization dedicated to breaking the cycle of child abuse and neglect through education, prevention, advocacy, and funding.</p>
